K Sports – 10:00-11:00

10:00 Meet & Greet on back patio under roof

10:25-10:45 gaga ball/free play (Gaga ball is a big-interest activity! Also imaginative play with the noodles, chalk, hula-hoops are done during free time)

Group "K" Topical Science Class-11:00-11:55

Class time is packed with many hands-on science experiments and activities that keep the attention of even the youngest students. The parents can read to their non-reading young students to prepare them for class. Homework pages are simple for this age and can be done orally or written, depending on child's ability and parent's desire. There is no textbook required for kindergartners. Parents can borrow library books or purchase simple reading books on the topics studied. Parents can tailor the homework to fit the needs of their child. There are often projects and activities sent home with the child to help further their studies. There are usually two opportunities for students to share a report on something they are studying. For example, one year, students may choose an animal to share about during the study on mammals. The report is simple and can include a poster of pictures. Non-reading students can point to the pictures on the poster to explain information. The teacher helps students with their presentation of the report they bring in. There are three cycles of topics for grades K-6. When a student studies a topic in kindergarten, they will be challenged with deeper reading and activities when the topics come around again. Topics for 2026-2027 are: Trees, Human Body, Weather, Simple Machines, Sound/Light, & Birds
